



Ready to grow or establish a facility in the City of Huron?

One of the first steps a new or existing business owner should take once they've decided they want to open a business in the City of Huron is to schedule a meeting with the local economic development office and City planning and building departments. This initial introduction can assist the process of becoming operational by foreseeing any challenges or hurdles businesses may face due to the nature of their business.

Will you be moving into an existing facility or constructing new/expanding a location? If existing, you'll want to work through the following checklist:

ZONING

Before signing your lease check:

- Check the Zoning Map to ensure your business type and use is appropriate based on the zoning of your location.
- Owner should have an occupancy permit. Change of use will result in the need for a new occupancy permit.
- O Notify the Fire Department of your new business and operation
- Before design and purchase, review signage regulation.

LOCAL LICENSING & PERMITTING



- O Is your business a food truck or food stand? You'll need to apply for a temporary store permit.
- Opening a restaurant? Check out the Food and Beverage Guide for the process to meet local requirements.
- Are you opening an Airbnb or short-term rental? You'll want to check with the city. Airbnb or short-term rentals are limited by the City of Huron.
- O Be familiar with the types of building renovations that require permitting. Cosmetic improvements like painting or flooring, typically do not require a building permit. However, structural renovations (ex. changing a window size, electrical upgrades) do require a building permit. Follow directions in section B.

STATE LICENSING

Liquor permits are handled at the state level. Specific attorneys are often hired to assist in the application process.

In Huron, the Planning Commission and Design Review Board meet on the 3rd Wednesday of every month at 5:00 p.m. in the Municipal Building Council Chambers.

Site plan applications are due the month before the meeting they will be presented (e.g. 4th Wednesday of May deadline for June meeting agenda item).

If constructing a new building for your business or doing a large renovation of existing building:

ZONING

- Check the Zoning map to ensure your zoning is appropriate for your business functions.
- O Change the size of your lot. Connect



with the cities planning and zoning department and fill out application before submitting to

the county. The application can be found $\underline{\ }$ here.

- If you are interested in a site but it is not zoned appropriately, you can apply for a re-zoning through this application.
- O Understand traffic patterns. Ensure you are familiar with the rules around traffic patterns and access ways as you design your new build. Check it out here.

ments, Additions, and New Construction.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR STARTING A NEW BUSINESS

Special considerations for starting a new business.

Are you a new business, start up, or entrepreneur that's trying to get your business incorporated and quickly up and running?

Take advantage of the local Regional Incubator for Sustainability & Entrepreneurship (RISE). RISE works with entrepreneurs in every phase of the business development process. Whether you are starting with just an idea in need of a plan, fresh start-ups in need of a boost, or a business looking to develop and execute a new growth strategy. We can give you access to expert advice and resources to help you start, develop, or accelerate your business. Our advisors are seasoned professionals in business and know what questions to ask to help you explore the many aspects of starting and running a business, including the list below! Work your way through this RISE recommended checklist for a solid legal and strategic foundation for a new business:

Checklist

- Create a business plan. A business plan should be feasible and cover a description of your products and services, potential competitors, marketing and sales ideas, and key partners, staff, or resources.
- Work on financial planning and projections that detail a worst, medium, and best-case scenario for the profitability of your business. You should have 1-3 years' worth of projections showing revenue and expenses quarterly or monthly.
- Form your LLC. Register with the state.

 Most small businesses will fall into this category when launching: LLC (Limited Liability Company). Other business entities can be researched here.
- Research and obtain necessary licenses in accordance with the state here.

- O Visit the IRS website (Internal Revenue

 Service website) to establish your

 Employer Identification Number (EIN).

 You will need an EIN to create a separate checking account for your business.
- Contact your bank to establish a checking account for your business. Separating personal and business finances is key for tax purposes. Some banks in the area include VacationLand Federal Credit Union, Civista Bank, First National Bank of Bellevue, Firelands Federal Credit Union, PNC, and US Bank.
- Obtain a Vendor's License, which authorizes you to collect sales tax. You can either apply online at the Ohio
 Business Gateway website or in-person at your local county auditor's office:
 Erie County Auditor's Office.



- ☐ Investigate Business insurance. Contact and get a quote from multiple providers to find the best fit for your business.

- Oget online! Make sure people can find your business by growing an online presence. You want to be visible when people google you. Ways to gain an online presence include claiming a My Business
- Google Listing; connecting to others on social media platforms like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter; and creating a website. Squarespace, GoDaddy or Wix are popular places to purchase a URL and set up a website.
- Some other helpful tools for your business include bookkeeping programs like QuickBooks, customer relationship management software like Salesforce, or email marketing platforms like Constant Contact or Mailchimp.

Economic Development Programs

Companies making a significant investment in the City of Huron may be eligible for assistance through the following program:

• Enterprise Zone Tax Abatement Guidelines and Application Certain new construction or renovation projects may be eligible for multi-year real estate tax abatement on the increased real estate tax liability of their project. This abatement provides real estate tax relief for a period of years and provide operations savings during the term of the abatement. All projects awarded real estate tax abatement under this program are required to meet or exceed a negotiated level of capital investment, new job creation and new payroll.

• Government Support

Local development has been carefully guided by Huron's administration. A zoning program has been implemented, and groups such as the Chamber of Commerce have supported the reservation of industrial tracts. In addition, the creation of the Huron Joint Port Authority has helped to ensure that the local harbor facilities can be developed to their maximum potential. The Port Authority continues working to create additional uses of the harbor in an effort to stimulate waterborne commerce in the community. They have recently completed a Port Master Plan that will serve as both a guideline and a marketing tool for future port development.
