By answering a few initial questions and then working through customized checklists, business owners can feel confident that they have met all the requirements to operate in good standing.

### Ready to grow or establish a facility in the City of Sandusky?

One of the first steps a new or existing business owner should take once they've decided they want to open a business in the City of Sandusky is to schedule a meeting with the local and city economic development groups. This initial introduction can assist the process of becoming operational by foreseeing any challenges or hurdles businesses may face due to the specific context of their business.

### Will you be moving into an existing facility or constructing new/ expanding a location?

If an existing facility, you'll want to work through the following checklist. (If building new continue to page 8.):

### ZONING

Before signing your lease:

- Check the Zoning Map to ensure your business type and use is appropriate based on the zoning of your location.
- Owner should have an occupancy permit. Change of use will result in the need for a new occupancy permit.
- If you're making exterior changes to the building, check to see if you're in a historic district. If so, you'll need to obtain a Certificate of Appropriateness for your proposed changes from the Sandusky Landmarks Commission.
- O Notify the Fire Department of your new business and operation.
- O Before design and purchase, review signage regulation. After reviewing signage regulation, check out the commercial sign permit.

### LOCAL LICENSING & PERMITTING



○ Is your business a food truck or food stand? You'll need a Public Vending License. Review and submit an Application.

- Opening a restaurant? Check out the Food and Beverage Guide for the process to meet local requirements.
- Are you opening an Airbnb or short-term rental? You'll want to check out 2:3 the transient rentals Application and Zoning Regulations.

Be familiar with the types of building renovations that require permitting. Cosmetic improvements, like painting or flooring, typically do not require a building permit. However, items falling under categories require permitting and those permits can be found on the City of Sandusky's online portal. Categories include: Building, Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, Stormwater, Excavating, Flood Plain, Fire Alarm, and Sprinklers.

### **STATE LICENSING**

Check state requirements at the official website of the State of Ohio: Licenses & Permits | Ohio.gov | Official Website of the State of Ohio

Liquor permits are handled at the state level. Specific attorneys are often hired to assist in the application process.

### If constructing a new building for your business or doing a large renovation of existing building:

### ZONING

Check the Zoning map to ensure your zoning is appropriate for your business function.

Change the Size of Your Lot. The process

of splitting or combining lots can be found here. If you've found the 3·4 perfect location but the size isn't right, depending on what you need you have two options. If you need a bigger size and there is available land, you can combine the spaces and keep it all under one name for convenience. If the space is bigger than what's needed, you can ask the owner to split the lot and have a chance to just purchase the space you need.

• To best understand the traffic patterns needed for your new building a meeting with the with the City Engineer, Josh Snyder is encouraged. This can be done after the preliminary drawings have been complete. Reach him at (419) 627-5875.

- Accessways to parking areas need to be planned ahead of time. Check out some of the requirements here.

### **SITE PLAN APPROVAL**



A registered design professional is the best resource to begin your site design.

The City Planning Division recommends scheduling a call or an informal meeting to discuss your site plan ideas before you prepare your formal submission.

• Submit site plan to the City of Sandusky Planning Division. Approval of site plan can take 6 - 8 weeks. This will include: setbacks, ingress/egress, parking, stormwater/grading, lighting, utilities location.

Changes may need to be made during this process to adhere to site requirements enacted by the City.



### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT**

• Working with registered contractors is the smoothest way to begin constructing your building. Contractors will need to pull the necessary permits and follow the inspection instructions found within each permit. Items falling under these categories require permitting and those permits can be found on the City of Sanduskys' online portal. Categories include: Building, Mechanical, electrical, Plumbing, Stormwater, Excavating, Flood Plain, Fire Alarm, and Sprinklers

O Before construction begins, you or your contractor must complete and submit the Commercial Plan Approval Application along with 3 copies of construction drawings developed by a registered design professional to the Building Department at 240 Columbus Avenue, Sandusky, Ohio 44870. The Building Department will have 30 days to respond to your application.

### **UTILITIES & OPERATIONS**

The City of Sandusky makes getting started easy with the Utilities Tap In and Set Up

C Excavation or Sewer Building Permit Application required for the installation, repair or replacement or abandonment of any storm or sanitary lateral.

O Sewer and water connections have a variety of fees (Sanitary Connection Fee, Water Tap-In Fee, Water Connection Fee). Review them here.

• Set up the remaining utilities for the business including: Ohio Edison/First Energy **Telecommunication Providers:** Buckeye Broadband, Spectrum O Trash Collection: Choose a local operator to set up your refuse and recycling collection. If you are located on Shoreline

### Special considerations for starting a new business.

### Are you a new business, start up, or entrepreneur that's trying to get your business incorporated and quickly up and running?

Take advantage of the local Regional Incubator for Sustainability & Entrepreneurship (RISE). RISE works with entrepreneurs in every phase of the business development process. Whether you are starting with just an idea in need of a plan, fresh start-ups in need of a boost, or a business looking to develop and execute a new growth strategy. RISE can give you access to expert advice and resources to help you start, develop, or accelerate your business. Our advisors are seasoned professionals in business and know what questions to ask to help you explore the many aspects of starting and running a business, including the list below! Work your way through this RISE recommended checklist for a solid legal and strategic foundation for a new business:

### Checklist

- O Create a business plan. A business plan should be feasible and cover a description of your products and services, potential competitors, marketing and sales ideas, and key partners, staff, or resources.
- Work on financial planning and projections that detail a worst, medium, and best-case scenario for the profitability of your business. You should have 1-3 years' worth of projections showing revenue and expenses quarterly or monthly.
- Form your LLC. Register with the state. Most small businesses will fall into this category when launching: LLC (Limited Liability Company). Other business entities can be researched here.
- O Research and obtain necessary licenses in accordance with the state here.

- Visit the IRS website (Internal Revenue Service website) to establish your Employer Identification Number (EIN). You will need an EIN to create a separate checking account for your business.
- O Contact your bank to establish a checking account for your business. Separating personal and business finances is key for tax purposes. Some banks in the area include VacationLand Federal Credit Union, Civista Bank, First National Bank of Bellevue, Firelands Federal Credit Union, PNC, and US Bank.
- Obtain a Vendor's License, which authorizes you to collect sales tax. You can either apply online at the Ohio Business Gateway website or in-person at your local county auditor's office: Erie County Auditor's Office.



- O Investigate business insurance. Contact and get a quote from multiple providers to find the best fit for your business. Some agencies in the area: Bodey Insurance Agency, Lindsley Insurance Agency, Steinemann Hafner Insurance, Willis Insurance Agency.
- **Get online!** Make sure people can find your business by growing an online presence. You want to be visible when people google you. Ways to gain an online presence include claiming a My Business Google Listing; connecting to others on

### **Economic Development Programs**

Companies making a significant investment in the City of Sandusky may be eligible for assistance through the following programs:

• Economic Development Fund Guidelines and Application

The Sandusky Economic Development Fund program is intended to spur and support economic development activities within the City of Sandusky ("the City"). Financial assistance is available for new or expanding businesses and/or property owners that will positively affect the economic and employment climates in the City of Sandusky.

Financial assistance for new or expanding businesses and/or property owners that will positively affect the economic and employment climates in the City of Sandusky.

• Enterprise Zone Tax Abatement Guidelines and Application

Certain new construction or renovation projects may be eligible for multi-year real estate tax abatement on the increased real estate tax liability of their project. This abatement provides real estate tax relief for a period of years and provide operations savings during the term of the abatement. All projects awarded real estate tax abatement under this program are required to meet or exceed a negotiated level of capital investment, new job creation and new payroll.
